Effective Community Interpreting: Honing our Skills For Deaf and Hearing Interpreters

This workshop, for Deaf and hearing interpreters, explores the skill sets and schemas required for effective community interpreting. Community interpreting requires awareness of discourse patterns and how participants construct meaning together in a given interaction, and the impact of our decisions on the evolving dialogue. The workshop is designed to allow participants to examine the opportunities, reasons, and decision-making points for blending the use of consecutive interpreting (CI) and simultaneous interpreting (SI) within community settings. By exploring the differences in the quality of our work when providing SI and CI, participants can consider their own work and the consequences of choices they make. The discussions will examine the multitude of features that can guide our decisions, ranging from discourse structures to the age of the consumer. The workshop will also allow for hands-on practice with local Deaf community members joining us for live role-plays.
